THE HISTORY WARS: FACTITIOUS FICTION OR FICTIOUS FACTS?



In the past decade neo liberal politics has nourished a 'debate' played out within the media and the academy, which has become popularly known as the 'history wars'. The leading personality in this debate is Keith Windschuttle and his work entitled: *The Fabrication of Aboriginal History* (2000). Several responses to Windschuttle have been mounted within the academy and public forums by Henry Reynolds, Robert Manne, Pat Grimshaw, Lyndall Ryan and

Stuart Macintyre. The publication of several books have followed such as Robert Manne's *Whitewash: On Keith Windschuttle's Fabrication of Aboriginal History* (2003), Bain Attwoods's *Telling the Truth About Aboriginal History* (2004) and Stuart MacIntyre and Anna Clark's *The History Wars* (2005). This all - Indigenous symposium offers a different perspective on the 'history wars'. Indigenous scholars will provide analyses and facilitate discussion about how the 'history wars' have impacted on Indigenous people and scholarship. Confirmed speakers include Professor John Maynard, Dr Irene Watson, Dr Wendy Brady, Dr Tony Birch, Associate Professor Tracey Bunda, Mr Greg Lehman, Mr Gary Foley, Ms Karen Martin, Ms Jean Phillips, Mr Victor Hart and Mr Phillip Falk.

Session leaders include: Professor John Maynard, Professor Aileen Moreton-Robinson, Dr Wendy Brady and Dr Irene Watson. The Indigenous Studies Masterclass is aimed at postgraduates and early career researchers. Each of the session leaders will conduct a workshop to facilitate discussion on each participant's research program. The master-class will provide opportunities for participants to undertake advanced study on issues surrounding research in the field of Indigenous studies and establish research networks for the future. Participants are expected to contribute actively to the Masterclass by actively discussing their current research or broader research program within workshops. A book of readings will be made available to participants.
